Walter Perry Trophy

Description

This trophy is presented to the winner of a photographic competition.

History

Walter Perry was at one time a Senior Manager at Girlings in Birmingham. He joined the St Mellon's Society when he moved to South Wales and built a "Britannia". He presented the trophy for the already established photographic competition in 1977. Unfortunately he died shortly before the first presentation.

Trophy Management

The trophy is presented annually. It is normally awarded at the society social evening held in the first quarter of the year. If a social evening is not held then the trophy can be awarded at a time to be decided by the committee.

The trophy is held by the winner for a period of 11 months, after which it must be returned to the event organiser to enable sufficient time for the next winner's details to be engraved on the trophy. A smaller plaque is then awarded to the winner, which can be retained.

Competition Rules

- The event is open to all current members of the society.
- The winner will be announced on the evening of the competition
- A maximum of four photographs per member can be submitted for the competition.
- There are no limitations on the subject matter of the photographs.
- The photographs may be black and white or colour, slides or prints.
- Entries may be a mix of the above.
- Previous photographs that have won the award will not be considered for the current competition.
- Entries are to be submitted in an envelope marked with the member's name.
- The event will be advertised on the society events board at least 2 weeks prior to the competition being held.
- In the event of only one entry for the competition the entry will be judged to be the winner on the basis of the member has taking the trouble to enter.

Judging Procedure

Entries will be judged by a person appointed by the committee. The judge will decide on the criteria to be applied.
